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FOREWORD / ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Governor Fitial and Lt. Governor Inos tasked a group to conduct a study to satisfy one the requirements of the Federal Law No. 110-229 on local prevailing wages and to obtain useful information on the workforce's demographics including education and skills levels.

The group came up with the Prevailing Wage and Workforce Assessment Study (PWWAS). The purpose of PWWAS was to 1) determine the type of occupations that exist and measure occupation-specific wage rates for each of the identified occupations in the local economy and 2) assess the current types and level of skills in the business community to determine areas that might benefit from training and enhancement.

The first part of the report was published on April 30, 2012 titled, 2011 CNMI PWWAS Occupation Hourly Wage and Fringe Benefit Report.

This report focuses on the second portion of the report by assessing current types and level of skills in the workforce.

Many individual efforts from businesses, organizations, and offices were combined to complete this Study. I would like to acknowledge and thank everyone who contributed to the completion of this work.

The CNMI business community provided the necessary data, which made this Study possible. A total of 1,806 businesses, autonomous agencies, private schools, and other private organizations were visited by the Study enumerators; 1,486 responded; 1,201 reported employee data to the Study. Business organizations including the Saipan Chamber of Commerce and the Korean Business Association encouraged their members to participate in the Study.

Government agencies—notably the Department of Finance, the Workforce Investment Agency (WIA), and the Department of Labor--contributed tremendously. The Department of Finance, Secretary Larissa Larson and her staff, provided the comprehensive list of establishments doing business or providing services in the Commonwealth, at the time of the Study, which became the basis for the data collection for this Study. Finance also provided the data on occupation, wages, and fringe benefits on government employees. The Director of the Workforce Investment Agency (WIA), Ms. Edith DL Guerrero, the Secretary of Labor, Gil San Nicolas and their staff were involved in the Study from the beginning and provided valuable reviews and inputs from the development of the questionnaire to the final report.

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INTRODUCTION

This second report¹ of the Prevailing Wage and Workforce Assessment Study (PWWAS) looks at 1) the demographic characteristics of employees, 2) the level of education, and 3) the level of various skills reported by employers at the time of the Study. It is important to point out that the findings in this second report are applicable appropriately only to two different segments of and do not necessarily represent that of the entire employed workforce population in the economy at the time of the Study. The two segments of the employed population profiled are 1) the 14,450 reported employees used in producing the occupation and wage statistics in the first report² and 2) about 6,000 employees reported by small employers, hereon, referred to as *small employers' employees*.

The first segment, comprising the 14,450 reported employees, was analyzed by cross-tabulating the variable *SOC Major Group Titles*³ with each of the seven variables—*Island, Sector, Age, Gender, Citizenship, Ethnic Group*, and *Industry Major Group*⁴—to reveal useful general information about this segment of the employed population. The results from these cross-tabulations are contained in the Appendix A, Tables 1 through 7. In addition to these tables, charts and brief statements on major points were created from these tables and are presented below under the next section "Reported Employees by Island, Demographics, and by Industry Major Group".

The second segment of the employed workforce, which the results in this second report profiles, consists of a smaller number of employees, about 6,000, reported by mostly small employers⁵. Of

⁵ The Study questionnaire was designed to allow for each establishment to provide employee data at its own choice: by providing all data items requested in the Person Page of the Questionnaire or provide only the basic requirements. In the Person Page of the Questionnaire, items P1, P4, P5, P7, P8, P10, P11, and P12 were considered minimum requirement. The rest of the items in the Person Page, which included Education Levels and levels of various skills, were considered optional. The completion status of the questionnaire was indicated by the field enumerator on the Cover Page and verified by the Office reviewers. Almost all larger employers provided only the basic requirement on the Person Page of the Questionnaire while almost all small employers (less than 10 employees) provided employee data on Education Levels and levels of skills. the 1,201 establishments that participated in the Study, 1,056 of them (with 5,651 employees) completed the questionnaire in full; 33 of them (with 174 employees) completed the questionnaire mostly; and 9 of them (with 141 employees) submitted forms that were mostly incomplete. Almost all of these 1,098 establishments were small employers with less than 10 total employees each, the majority of which employed less than 5 workers. These small employers (and only a few of the relatively larger ones) reported employee data on levels of education and on several skills. The skills reported on included English Reading, English Speaking, English Writing, Basic Arithmetic, Accounting, Management, Marketing, Sales and Advertising, Word Processing, Spreadsheet, Windows Operating System, Internet, Database, Website and Web Pages, Programming, and Customer Service. The Education Levels of these small employers' employees were cross-tabulated with the same seven variables--Island, Sector, Age, Gender, Citizenship, Ethnic Group, and Industry Major Groups—and the results are contained in the Appendix A, Tables 8 through 14. Similarly, charts and brief statements on major points based on these tables are presented below under the section "Small Employers' Employees Education Levels". Also, each of the employee skills was crosstabulated by the same seven variables and their results are contained in Tables 15 through 30 in the Appendix A. Likewise, charts and brief statements on major points created from these tables are presented below under the section "Small Employers' Employees' Skills". The case processing summary for each of the cross-tabulations for the tables and charts are in Appendix B.

It is cautioned that one may have to look at both a chart and its associated statements and also the appropriate table in the Appendix to have a complete picture of each of the topics covered. Because the row and/or column distributions and totals may contain small numbers, a chart and associated statements may not be enough to convey complete information about a particular topic. For example, on page 12, Chart 9 shows that a higher percentage of small employers' employees in the public sector have higher education (levels above high school) than in the private sector. But, as shown in Table 9 in the Appendix, the public sector is a very small portion of the small employers' employees group as whole; a point seen only by looking at Table 9, in addition, to Chart 9.

And, again, the results in this report describe the two defined segments of and not the entire employed population in the CNMI at the time of the Study.


While the results may not reliably represent the characteristics for the entire employees' population, they can be used to 1) gain insights into the identified segments of the employed population and 2) provides useful information for determining training and educational needs of the employees who were reported upon by small employers in the CNMI.

REPORTED EMPLOYEES' BY ISLAND, DEMOGRAPHICS, AND INDUSTRY MAJOR GROUP

SOC Major Group Titles by Island

As shown in Chart 1 below (and in Table 1 in the Appendix), the vast majority of workers in all SOC Major Group Titles in the Study were in Saipan, with slight exceptions in the Personal Care and Services and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations in Tinian and in the Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations in Rota. About 89% of all reported employees came from Saipan, 7% from Tinian, and 4% from Rota⁶. Tinian has more employees than Rota mainly because of the large number of workers employed by Tinian Dynasty, a hotel and casino establishment. It is important to note here also that while Tinian and Rota have fewer total employees in their economies, compared to Saipan, their reported totals represent almost all employees in these two islands. Because the number of establishments in these two islands is small, enumerators were able to account for almost all of them and completed a questionnaire for each one.






⁶ According to the 2010 CNMI Census, the CNMI's total population was 53,883: 48,220 (89.5%) in Saipan, 3,136 (5.8%) in Tinian, and 2,527 (4.7%) in Rota.

SOC Major Group Titles by Sector

The Private sector employees dominated in the Sales and Related Occupations, Major Occupational Title Production Occupations, Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, Personal Care and Service Occupations, Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations, Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations, Transportation and Material Moving Occupations, Arts, Design, Entertainment, Sports, and Media Occupations, Construction and Extraction Occupations, and in Architecture and Engineering Occupations.

The Public sector employees were dominant in Community and Social Service Occupations, Education, Training, and Library Occupations, Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations, Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations, and the Legal Occupations. 


SOC Major Group Titles by Age Group

Relatively fewer younger workers, less than 30 years old, were in the Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations, Construction and Extraction Occupations, Building and Grounds, Cleaning, and Maintenance Occupations, and Management Occupations, Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations, Architecture and Engineering Occupations, Healthcare Practitioners, and technical Occupations, Major Occupational Title Production Occupations, and Business and Financial Operations Occupations.

Relatively fewer older workers, 50 years old or older, were in the Sales and Related Occupations, Protective Services Occupations, Arts, Design, Entertainment, Sports, and Media Occupations, Office and Administrative Support Occupations, and Community and Social Services Occupations. 


SOC Major Group Titles by Gender

Females were dominant in the Healthcare Support Occupations, Sales and Related Occupations, Business and Financial Operations Occupations, Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations, and in Education, Training, and Library Occupations.

Males were dominant in the Major Occupational Title Production Occupations, Computer and Mathematical Occupations, Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations, Transportation and Material Moving Occupations, Protective Service Occupations, Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations, Architecture and Engineering Occupations, Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations, and in the Construction and Extraction Occupations. SOC Major Group Titles by Citizenship

Non-U.S. Citizens were dominant in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, Personal Care and Service Occupations, Construction and Extraction Occupations, Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations, Major Occupational Title Production Occupations, Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations, and in Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

U.S. citizens were dominant in Legal Occupations, Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations, Community and Social Service Occupations, Office and Administrative Support Occupations, and in the Protective Service Occupations. See Chart 5 below and Table 5 in the Appendix for details.




Chart 5 SOC Major Titles by Citizenship: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI


SOC Major Group Titles by Ethnic Group

Chamorros and Carolinians were dominant in the Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations, Protective Service Occupations, and Community and Social Service Occupations. They were somewhat dominant in the Management Occupations, Business and Financial Operations, Legal Occupations, Transportation and Material Moving Occupations, Office Administrative Services Support Occupations, Computer and Mathematical Occupations, Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations, and in the Healthcare Support Occupations. Caucasians were dominant in the Legal Occupations.

Filipinos were dominant in the highest number of different occupational major groups including the Major Occupational Title Production Occupations, Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations, Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations, Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations, Construction and Extraction Occupations, Installation, Maintenance, and Repair Occupations, Arts, Design, Entertainment, Sports, and Media Occupations, Architecture and Engineering Occupations, Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations, Transportation and Material Moving Occupations, Sales and Related Occupations, Business and Financial Operations Occupations, and in the Personal Care and Service Occupations.

Other Asians were dominant in the Education, Training, and Library Occupations and somewhat dominant in Personal Care and Service Occupations, Healthcare Support Occupations, and in the Management Occupations. See Chart 6 below and Table 6 in the Appendix for details.


Chart 6 SOC Major Titles by Major Ethnic Group: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI



SOC Major Group Titles by Industry Major Group

The largest industry was the Public Administration, followed by the Accommodation and Food Services industry, Retail Trade, Education Services, Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services, Construction, etc. See Chart 7 below for details. The Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting industry was the smallest, in the number of employees reported. 
Chart 7 SOC Major Titles by Major Industry: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI



SMALL EMPLOYERS' EMPLOYEES' EDUCATION LEVELS

The findings in this section describe the education level of the small employers' employees segment of the total employed population at the time of the Study. Overall, 49% of employees of small employers were High School graduates, 18% had a Bachelor's, 15% had Some College, 9% had a Vocational Certificate, 4% had an Associate's degree, 2% had a Master's, and 3% had less than a High School diploma.

Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Island

On each of the islands, employees with a High School education had the highest percentage. Tinian had the highest percent with Some College and a Bachelor's degree, while Rota had the highest percent with a Vocational Certificate. See Chart 8.2 below and Table 8 in the Appendix for details.




Chart 8.2 Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Island: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI

Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Sector

A higher percentage of the Public sector had higher levels of education compared to the Private sector; however, the Public sector is a very small portion of this group as a whole.

Only some of the small employers in the Public sector reported level of educations and skills⁷. In the private sector, however, the majority of establishments were small employers most of whom reported their employees' level of education and skills; hence, the figures here represent well the Private sector. Private sector far outnumbered their counterpart in the Public sector, hence, the distribution of Education Level in the Private sector dictates the distribution of the group as a whole, as shown in Chart 9 below and in Table 9 in the Appendix A.





Chart 9 Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Sector: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI

⁷ There were ten Public sector establishments at the time of the Study. Four Public sector small employers with a total of 46 employees reported employee Education Level. The larger public sector employers include the CNMI government, the Public School System, Commonwealth Utilities Corporations, and the Northern Marianas College. The Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation was still under the CNMI Government at the time of the Study. The CNMI Government was the largest single employer in the CNMI.

Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Age Group

Expectedly, higher education level is directly related with employees' age: older workers tend to have completed higher levels of education, as shown in Chart 10 below. More than half of employees below age 30 had only a High School diploma, while higher percentages of employees aged 30 or more had a Bachelor's degree or a Master's degree. Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Gender

An interesting finding by gender is that in this segment of the employed population, a higher percentage of Females have education levels higher than Males. For example, about 24% of employed Females, compared to about 15% of Males, had a Bachelor's degree. See Chart 11 below and Table 11 in the Appendix for details.

Chart 11 Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Gender: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI




Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Citizenship

About 50% of all U.S. citizens working for small employers had a High School diploma, 13% had Some College, about 12% had a Bachelor's, about 5% had an Associate's degree, and about 4% had a Master's degree.

About 45% of Non-U.S. citizens had a High School diploma, 19% had a Bachelor's, about 15% had Some College, and 10% had a Vocational certificate. See Chart 12 below and Table 12 in the Appendix for details.

Chart 12 Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Citizenship: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI




Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Ethnic Group

More than half (53%) of Chamorros and Carolinians working for small employers had a High School diploma, 14% had Some College, and about 6% had a Bachelor's, and about 5% had an Associate's degree.

More than one-third of Caucasians working for small employers had a Bachelor's degree and 22% had a Master's degree.

About 42% of Filipinos had a High School Diploma, about 21% had a Bachelor's, and about 16% had Some College, while 12% had a Vocational Certificate. See Chart 13 below and Table 13 in the Appendix for details.


Chart 13 Small Employers' Employees' Education Level by Ethnic Group: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI



Small Employers' Employees' Place of Education

The vast majority (about 76%) of small employers' employees received their education and training from outside the United States. This is mainly because of the reliance of small employers on employees from outside of the United States, particularly from the Philippines, as well as other Asian countries. Disaggregating by citizenship, close to half (49%) of all U.S. citizen small employers' employees got their education and training in the CNMI, about 24% from the elsewhere in the U.S., about 12% from outside the U.S., with about 15% unknown. SMALL EMPLOYERS' EMPLOYEES' SKILLS

Like in the previous section, findings here describe only the small employers' employees and are not necessarily applicable to the entire employed workforce in the economy at the time of the Study. In the same presentation format, charts and notable points are shown here while related tables are referred to in the Appendix.

English Reading Skills

By Island: A higher percentage of small employers' employees in Rota and Tinian, than in Saipan, need some training in English Reading according to small employers. In numbers, however, Saipan had the vast majority of the small employers' employees in this area.

By Sector: Almost half (45%) of the Private sector small employers' employees need some training in English Reading, compared to only about 5% in Public sector. However, the Public sector is a tiny portion of the group as a whole.

By Age Groups: There is not a big difference by age groups, little less than half of small employers' employees in all age groups need some training in English Reading.

By GENDER: There is no big difference by gender, less than half of both Male and Female employees need some training in English Reading.





Chart 15.1 Small Employers' Employees English Reading Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI

By U.S. CITIZENSHIP: About a quarter of U.S. citizens and about half of non-U.S. citizens need some training in English Reading.

By Major Ethnic Groups: Only about 5% of Caucasians need some training in English Reading. About 24% of Chamorros and Carolinians, 35% of Other Pacific Islanders, 48% of Filipino working for small employers need some training in English Reading. 


By Age Group: There is no big difference by age groups, little less than half of in all age groups need some training in English Speaking.

By U.S. CITIZENSHIP: About a quarter of U.S. citizens and more half of non-U.S. citizens need some training in English Speaking.



Chart 16.1 Small Employers' Employees English Speaking Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS. CNMI






By AGE GROUPS: There is no big difference by Age groups; little less than half in all age groups need some training in English Writing.



Chart 17.1 Small Employers' Employees English Writing Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI









Chart 18.1 Small Employers' Employees Basic Arithmetic Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI








Chart 19.1 Small Employers' Employees Accounting Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI








Chart 20.2 Small Employers' Employees Management Skills by SOC Major Group Titles: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI




Chart 21.1 Small Employers' Employees Marketing, Sales, and Advertising Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI







Chart 22.1 Small Employers' Employees Business Writing and Speaking Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI









Chart 23.1 Small Employers' Employees Business Word Processing Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI









Chart 24.1 Small Employers' Employees Business Spread Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI















Chart 26.1 Small Employers' Employees Internet Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI









Chart 27.1 Small Employers' Employees Database Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI









Chart 28.1 Small Employers' Employees Website and Web Pages Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI









Chart 29.1 Small Employers' Employees Programming Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI









Chart 30.1 Small Employers' Employees Customer Service Skills by Demographics: 2011 PWWAS, CNMI




