FIGURE 1.1 - BANKING ACTIVITY - DEPOSITS




FIGURE 1.2 - BANKING ACTIVITY - LOANS



FIGURE 2 - REMITTANCE



Figure 3 - Auto Sales



FIGURE 4 - VISITOR ARRIVAL



FIGURE 5 - AVERAGE CNMI HOTEL DAILY RATE



FIGURE 6 - AVERAGE CNMI HOTEL OCCUPANCY RATE



FIGURE 7 - BUSINESS GROSS REVENUE (BGR) REPORTED




FIGURE 9 - GENERAL FUND REVENUE (TAXES AND FEES COLLECTED)










FIGURE 12.1 - COMMERCIAL PHONE LINES BY ISLAND




FIGURE 12.2 - RESIDENTIAL PHONE LINES BY ISLAND




FIGURE 12.3 - COMMERCIAL & RESIDENTIAL PHONE LINES (TOTALS)



FIGURE 13.1 - NUMBER OF BUILDING PERMITS ISSUED




FIGURE 13.2 - VALUES OF BUILDING PERMITS ISSUED (IN MILLIONS)


